General Description

Complies with county regulations; operates compactor and baler; keeps the grounds and office clean.

Loads and fills bins properly; reports issues; monitors used oil containment area for oil spills; ensures compactor is kept clean.

Attends OSHA training including CPR/first aid, employee meetings, etc. as deemed necessary.

Documents recycling company pickup of used oil, textiles, cardboard, etc.

Informs citizens of mandatory recycling requirements.

Follows mandatory recycling requirements and OSHA regulations to ensure health and safety of citizens.

Performs related work as assigned.
